Social Media and Emerging Applications: Investigative Potential and Issues

This interactive presentation will provide an overview of the latest trends and traps in digital investigations, including social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc.) and emerging apps (such as WhatsApp, Secret, Whisper, Yik Yak). It will also cover the latest trends and traps in computer forensics, including recent developments in mobile search and seizure; peer-to-peer investigations (particularly the rising popularity of BitTorrent); the growing challenges of mobile, network, and cloud forensics; and ongoing anti-forensics efforts. Other topics will include: The Potential For and Limits of Selfie-Incrimination and Issues Arising Out of Undercover Investigations Online.

INSTRUCTOR: Frederick Lane is a nationally-recognized expert on privacy and the impact of emerging technologies on society. He is an author, attorney, educational consultant, expert witness, and lecturer who has spoken to colleges, universities, and school districts around the country on a variety of issues, including student safety, electronic misbehavior, and digital privacy. Lane has worked as a computer forensics expert for the past fourteen years, assisting in the investigation and defense of a wide range of cases. He has been retained as a consulting expert in nearly 100 child pornography cases, and in 2014 was accepted as an expert by the Defense Office of Hearings and Appeals in the methodology and technology used to create, distribute, and acquire child pornography. He is a graduate of Amherst College in 1985 with a degree in Classics and American Studies, and from Boston College Law School in 1988.
