





# The Best Revenge Is a Bullying App

Gregory Bender's Anonymous Alerts, an app that lets students to report bullying

Gregory Bender was bullied back in the 1970s when he went to Saint David's School on the Upper East Side. "By a kid who was half my size," he remembered. "I was terrified of this kid."

Mr. Bender didn't get mad. He got even—on a grand scale. He created Anonymous Alerts, an app that allows students to report bullying to school officials without having to reveal their identities.

The app is in use in 1,500 schools nationwide, the entrepreneur said, with more signing up every day.

"I just sold three people on the way down from Westchester," he told me.

Mr. Bender's being bullied wasn't the catalyst that caused him to create the app—the Sandy Hook mass shooting was. But his own experience wasn't far from his mind.

While much of the past becomes a blur, there's something about being bullied that never fades. The fear. The sense of impotence. The injustice of it. There might even be a tendency to blame yourself: Popular kids don't get bullied, or so it appears to the unpopular.

If anything, things seem to have gotten worse with the Internet, said Mr. Bender.

"This world is a lot different than it was 10 or 20 years ago. Kids identify themselves with their online presence. Their identity becomes a digital reality."

He added: "One in four kids is bullied every year; 160,000 kids every day stay home from school from bullying. And one in 10 drop out."

Here's how the app works: Schools or school districts buy it customized to their requirements—the price depends on the size of the district; one in Florida has 120,000 students, 40,000 employees and 185 schools, Mr. Bender said—and then distribute it for free.

Their students can report anything and everything—from gang violence to bulimia—and where it's taking place, such as the cafeteria or the school bus, establishing an anonymous dialogue with school administrators. They also can attach a photo or a video.

Mr. Bender cited a scene not long ago at a South Carolina school.

"They confiscated a 12-inch knife a high-school student was carrying to school and was going to stab other students," he reported. "They went to the kid's locker, found the weapon, confiscated the weapon and expelled the kid from school."

Another time, the app was use to break up a heroin ring at high school in Idaho.

"One of the kids tipped off the district that three kids were dealing heroin in the school," Mr. Bender said. "They were able to find the kids, confiscate the heroin and shut down the ring.

"It's a deterrent to bad things happening," he added.

I wondered how anonymous Anonymous Alerts really was. Wouldn't bullies have a pretty good idea who was reporting them and perhaps seek revenge? And why couldn't the app be used to file a false report by someone settling scores? Or simply as a prank?

But Lorraine Termini, the dean of student life at Greenwich High School in Greenwich, which bought the app in September, said she isn't aware of any of the school's 2,600 students abusing it.

"We were afraid that we could be getting a lot of nonsense," she said. But of the 83 anonymous alerts the school has received, only two or three weren't legitimate.

She offered a partial breakdown: 33% of the alerts were reports of drug and alcohol abuse; 17% related to bullying; and 8% were related to depression.

"We've had hospitalizations of kids" who were considered suicide risks based on information received through Anonymous Alerts. "Five cases where the police have sent someone to the house."

Mr. Bender said many episodes are caused by students with mental-health issues, and possibly no one is better able to detect a teenager's despair than a close friend.

"There's got to be a way for kids to talk about something anonymously, such as strange behavior, before tragedy happens," he said.

When bullying is reported, Greenwich High School will contact the alleged perpetrator's family. "We don't say, 'You're a bully,' "Ms. Termini explained. "We say, 'We received this information.' We call the parents in."

Another issue that generates alerts, Mr. Bender said, though it hasn't arisen at Greenwich High School, is cheating. It takes courage to report cheating. It's easier if it can be done anonymously.

"There's a lot of pressure to do well," he explained. "This helps kids not to take shortcuts, but to do the right thing."

Ironically, Mr. Bender eventually became friends with his bully. They were in a seventh-grade computer lab together. He went on to graduate from Fordham Prep in the Bronx and the New School/Parsons School of Design.

I wondered whether Mr. Bender had ever confronted his assailant and asked why he'd bullied him. He had. "He said, 'Because I could and because you feared me.'"

He hasn't pitched his app to Saint David's. "I've been focused on the rest of the country," he said, and turned to his assistant. "In fact, let's call them tomorrow. We'll give it to them for free."
